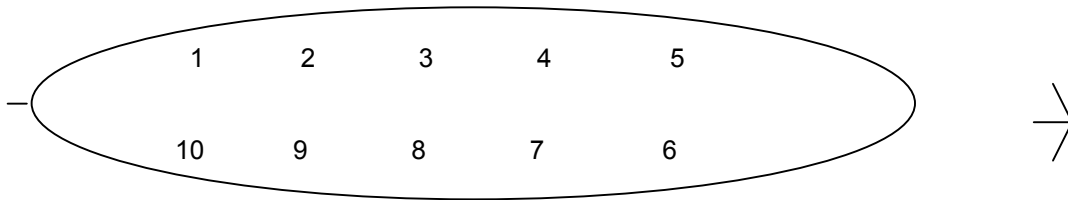
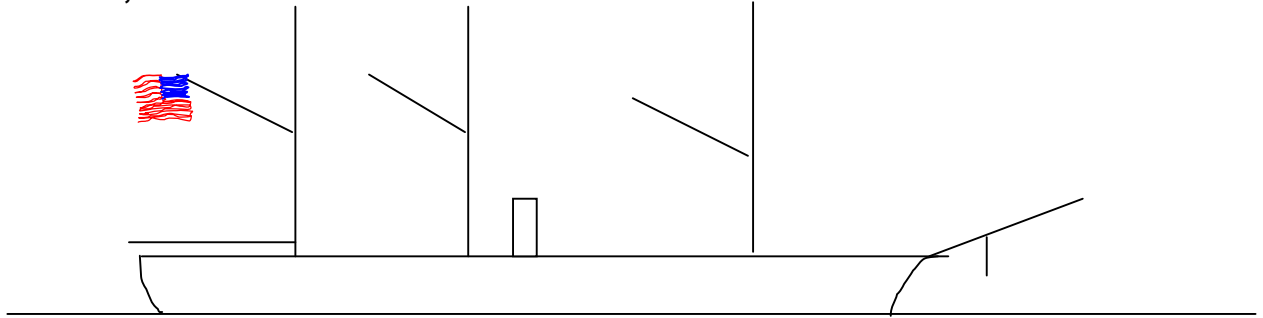


Ironclad Control Sheet

All guns are exposed on the weather deck. Angle of bearing assumed to be 20° either side of directly abeam. Light chase guns are best represented as a long ranged pepperer with all round fire. Marines give two short-ranged pepperers in the tops with all round fire.

Miscellaneous

225 x 44 x c 17 ft – so medium draught. Wooden. No ram. Flagship of the immortal Farragut. Speed needs to be confirmed: there are wide discrepancies in reference books. For some of her runs past forts chain and other improvised armour was fitted, giving G protection to her boilers, vitals and waterline max. Reduces speed by 2 knots. Can only be fitted if the scenario specifically permits. Armament shown is prob that carried from the start of the War. Was augmented by June of 1863. For which see next card. Large sloop. L 1858. 26 PF.
