


## **Ironclad Control Sheet**



## **Batteries**

30 pdr rifle bow. 20 pdr rifle stern. Two 12 pdr howitzers to port. One to starboard. Count as two long-ranged pepperer in anything but a skirmish.

## Armour

Iron or maybe two foot of oak protected the boilers and engine. Counts as just about G armour against boiler and engine hits. Cotton bales and maybe some other improvised armour, protected other parts, but not enough to register in the rules in their present state.

## **Miscellaneous**

Wooden ram. 180' x 37'6" x 8' – so just about boat draught. Converted by Col Charles Rivers Ellet for the Union. Sunk her off Fort de Russy, La., on the Red River, on 14<sup>th</sup> February 1863. Later raised and served with the Confederacy. Sunk in action on the Atchafalaya River, 14<sup>th</sup> April 1863. Note, I have a much higher speed for her in US service – check. 26 PF.
