### Terrain

The river Enipeus on the Pompeian right/Caesarian left is in a gully and counts as a major obstacle. There is no other terrain of consequence, though purely for dioramic effect the start of some steeper hills might be placed on the Pompeian and Pomepeian left/Caesarian right table edges, with perhaps the ramparts of the Pompeian camp behind their army.

## Deployment

The historical deployment is outlined above. The armies should deploy about 10-15 JTs apart.

The players may alternatively agree to reorganise the commands and deployment positions to suit their own battle plans. If they do so, Caesar's player may opt to reorganise his legions as well. He can choose to reduce the total cohorts per legion to 7 (full strength stands) instead of the 4 full strength and 6 under-strength stands as listed above. If this happens, Caesar's cohort reserve can also be dispensed with, adding 1 full strength stand extra to each legion except for the X Legion.

### **Victory Conditions**

Both sides need to achieve a decisive victory, so battle is fought until this is achieved.

#### Notes

Pharsalus needs to be big! There is little way around this fact, so the OoB will be difficult to adjust for players with fewer stands. You could potentially reduce the size of the units on both sides by between 1/4 and 1/3, but no smaller. The number of leaders should remain the same. The beauty of using the given quotas is that a single stand of legionaries correponds exactly to one cohort.
